
♦ اسمُ الجِنْسِ

اسمُ الجِنْسِ *common noun* is the opposite of الْعَلَمُ *proper name*.

A proper name (الْعَلَمُ) can be applied to a particular person or place, e.g.



Whereas a common noun (اسمُ الجِنْسِ) can be applied to all the members of the genus, e.g.,



اسْمُ الْجِنْسِ الْجَمْعِيُّ

اسم الجنس الجمعي refers to the genus, and so, it is plural in meaning, e.g.:

العربُ	التركُ	الرومُ
al-'arab-u	al-turk-u,	al-rūm-u,
<i>the Arabs</i>	<i>the turks</i>	<i>the Byzantians</i>

التمرُ	الموزُ	السمَكُ
al-tamr-u	al-mawz-u,	al-samak-u
<i>dates</i>	<i>bananas</i>	<i>fish</i>

To form the singular of the first type, a *yā'* is added, e.g.,

arabiyy-un	عَرَبِيٌّ	يُّ عَرَبٌ
turkiyy-un	تُرْكِيٌّ	يُّ تُرْكٌ
rūmiyy-un	رُومِيٌّ	يُّ رُومٌ
etc.		

And to form the singular of the second type, a *tā' marbūtah* is added, e.g.,

tamr-at-un

تمْرَةٌ

samak-at-un

اسمُ الجَمْعٍ

A collective noun in English means a singular noun which refers to a group of people like a *committee*, a *team* etc.

Such a type of noun is called اسمُ الجَمْعٍ in Arabic.
