Dear Shaykh,

In Q69 *āyāt* 19 and 25 the word ﴿كِتَابِي﴾ has *sukūn*.

Faḍīlat al-Shaykh Dr. V. Abdur Rahim (حفظه الله) replies:




Dear Brother

وعليكم السلام


The *sākin hā'* at the end of the word is the هَاءُ السَّكْتِ which has been introduced in D2:6 (the example given there is لِمَةٌ). This comes only at the end of a sentence.

In Q69, there are other words as well which end in هَاءُ السَّكْتِ. These are:

﴿حَسَائِيهِ﴾ (26) 

﴿مَالِيهِ﴾ (28) 

﴿سُلْطَانِيهِ﴾ (29) 

It also occurs in Q101:10 ﴿مَا هِيَهُ﴾. 

I hope this has helped you to understand the problem.
