How do we make dual of a $maqs\bar{u}r$ noun like مُسْتَشْفًى ?

Fadilat al-Shaykh Dr. V. Abdur Rahim (حفظه الله) replies:



Dear Sister Halima,

The *maqsūr* noun may be either:

- A) thulāthiyy, (أُسلاَثِي) i.e., with three letters, or
- B) non-thulāthiyy, i.e., with more than three letters.
- A) If the thulāthiyy is written with alif like,

its third radical is wāw.

So in *muthannā* the third radical is changed to *wāw*:

And if the *thulāthiyy* is written with $y\bar{a}^{\prime}$ like:



its third radical is $y\bar{a}^{2}$.

So in *muthannā* the third radical is changed to $y\bar{a}^{j}$:

The Glorious Qur'ān says:



B) In a non-thulāthiyy noun the alif which is written as $y\bar{a}^{\gamma}$ is changed to $y\bar{a}^{\gamma}$:

pronounced: mustashfayāni.

pronounced: muṣṭafayāni.
