Lately a lot of people are saying that the word صلاة comes from the word صلة meaning connection. I find this very strange because from what I have learned in the Madinah Books the word صلة would be the maṣdar of صلاة whereas the word صلاة it's root would be or صلاء. I also find it like this in the Hans Wehr and Lisānu l-ʿArab dictionaries.

I sincerely hope the Shaikh can clarify the root of this important word and if what they say, is correct.

is derived from the root صلاَةٌ and صَلاَةٌ originally means «دُعَاءٌ».
