Could you please shed some light on what مُوجَب literally means and in the context of grammar?

- O The verb وَجَبُ (a-i) means to become obligatory.
- The maṣdar إيسجاب also has the meaning of being positive, affirmative.
- o ایْجَابِے means positive, affirmative, and its opposite is ایْجَابِے meaning negative.
- O The ism al-maf ْul of مُوجَبُ is أُو ْجَبُ, and as a grammatical term it means positive.
