- a) The مَصْدَر may have the meaning of اسْمُ الْمَفْعُول, e.g., اسْمُ الْمَفْعُول. As a مَصْدَر it means study. But it also has the meaning of what is studied as in «الدَّرْسُ الأُوَّل». In this sense, it has dual and plural.
- b) «نَصِيحة» as an اسْمُ الْمَفْعُول has the meaning of a piece of advice. So it can have plural.
