The grammarians hold a purely philosophical view. According to them nouns can be referred to as منصوب, مرفوع only when they are in a sentence. Outside the sentence, they have no *i"raabic* status. This view is philosophically correct. When we speak of nouns outside a sentence we say: بَيْت , قَلَم , كِتَاب

But some nouns like بَحْنُ ,أنتَ ,هِيَ , هُوَ , etc. have been created in the مرفوع form. Here we do not have the philosophical form with zeroending.

So we may say that مرفوع is the مرفوع form when in a sentence, and also the philosophical neutral form when outside the sentence.
